For the last 16 years, I have worked extensively with energy and utility-regulation policy and law. I understand the need for and the basis of economic regulation. I also understand the complexity of this regulation; each decision involves technological feasibility, economics, finance, law and policy, and the competing interests of various parties, including an individual group's current and future interests. A change in any one of these factors requires a reassessment of all others, and a rebalancing of the interests.

I also understand the importance of the Commission's work. One of the primary reasons for economic regulation is that the good or service involved is a necessity. Consumers need a fair and reasonable price, and want it to be as low as possible. However, to ensure that they continue to have a reliable source of these goods and services, the company's infrastructure and finances must be kept sound. This is where the temporal balancing comes in, balancing today's reasonable prices against the cost of ensuring that tomorrow's reliability needs are met.

The statutory fields of competency and expertise relate to these factors, for example, engineers better understand the technological feasibility, economists the economic needs and feasibility, and accountants the record keeping and auditing necessary for adequate oversight. However, meeting the statutory requirements is simply the starting point in being competent to implement regulatory policy and law and protect the citizens of this state. What is ultimately essential, and is at the heart of economic regulation, is an understanding of how these factors fit together and how to correctly effectuate the balancing process. This is what I have learned and applied in the legislative setting for the past 16 years. This knowledge and skill will be crucial for the Commission in the near future, for example, in implementing the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's carbon-reduction rules in a way that minimizes costs and maximizes benefits.
